ELECTROCUTED AT SING SING.

One Murder Case in Which Justice Was Swift.

Ossining, N. Y., Aug. 4.—Protecting his innocence, Antonio Turkowski, a Pole, who was convicted of the murder of John Shepolski, a Brooklyn saloon keeper, was taken to the electric chair in Sing Sing prison and put to death. The execution was conducted by Principal Keeper Connaughton. When Turkowski had been strapped in the chair a current of 1,700 volts and 7 amperes was turned on and continued for half a minute, then reduced to 200 volts. After the reduced current had been kept up a minute an examination was made by Prison Physician Irvin and Dr. P. Collard of Ossining, who found the man still alive. A second shock was given, and at the end of three minutes Turkowski was pronounced dead. The body will be buried in quicklime in the cemetery near the prison.

The case is noteworthy in that Turkowski was the first person to be executed in the electric chair whose case had not been carried to a higher court. The time between his sentence and execution was even less than that accorded Czolgosz, who murdered President McKinley.

Syracuse, N. Y., Aug. 4.—Oscar W. Little, thirty-two years old, a liveryman, has committed suicide by taking chloral. He was despondent over his inability to sleep.
