International Geological Congress.

Vienna, Aug. 21.—The international geological congress has opened its sessions here. The United States was represented by George F. Becker, Bally Willis and S. F. Emmons of the United States geological survey, Washington; J. P. Iddings of Chicago, and C. R. Van Hise of Wisconsin. The Canadian delegate is Robert Bell of Ottawa.

Prohibitionists Unveil a Monument.

Bloomington, Ill., Aug. 22.—Prohibitionists of the United States have unveiled at Newton, Jasper county, a magnificent monument to the memory of Hale Johnson, who was assassinated on election day last year. He was chairman of the Prohibition state committee and national committeeman at the time and was the vice presidential candidate on the Prohibition ticket in 1896. Many states were represented at the exercises.

Big Strike in Saxony.

Crimmitschau, Saxony, Aug. 22.—About 7,500 textile workers of this district have struck for shorter hours of labor. The police broke up four meetings because nonresident officials of the Textile Workers' union addressed them. A fifth mass meeting was allowed to continue.

Fourth Class Postmasters Appointed.

Washington, Aug. 22.—The following fourth class postmasters have been appointed: Pennsylvania—Bessie A. Shannon, Callery; William T. Reese, Everson; George F. Good, St. Davids.

Lord Salisbury Sinking.

London, Aug. 22.—Lord Salisbury is still alive, but he is surely sinking. He received the last sacrament. Oxygen is being administered.

GLEANINGS.

Over a million head of game were shot in Hungary last year, including stags, bears, wolves and wildcats.

Germany owns 10,250 miles of telegraph cable, or one twenty-fourth of the entire system of the world, while Britain owns two-thirds of the total mileage.

A company has been formed to work the salt beds discovered at the Point of Ayre, Isle of Man, and outlay pipes have been carried seven miles to evaporation works at Ramsey.

It is reported that in view of the looting of Boer Bibles that took place during the late war the British Bible society is to make a free distribution of 5,000 Dutch Bibles bound in leather.

Ex-President Kruger's residence at Pretoria is now used as a lodging house. The following advertisement appeared in a Pretoria paper: "To Let—Ex-President Kruger's late residence; a few nicely furnished bedrooms, with board, etc."

The only heavy cut necessary in making the ship canal across Scotland from the German sea to the Atlantic, near Glasgow, will be one at Loch Lomond, averaging 200 feet deep for one and three-quarter miles. In the remainder of the route the average will be fifty feet.
