Danny Maher Hiding Again.

London, Aug. 26.—Danny Maher, the American jockey, returned to the Epsom race course, appearing at the York August meeting. He signaled the occasion by winning the Bradgate Park selling plate (of 100 sovereigns, for two-year-olds and upward, six furlongs) on Rather Warm. This was the first race in which he had ridden since the motor car accident which happened to him near Caterham, Surrey, July 10. He was given a great reception. Maher subsequently won the chief event of the day, the Prince of Wales plate (of 1,000 sovereigns, by subscription of 10 sovereigns each, for two-year-olds, five furlongs) on Cinquetail W. C. Whitney's Hands Down, ridden by W. H. ("Skeets") Martin, was third.

Four Hundred Men Idle.

Pittsburg, Aug. 26.—About 400 men are idle at the Continental mill of the National Tube company, a subsidiary concern of the United States Steel corporation, because the annual wage scale has not been signed. The Continental has been running steadily for ten years, and the action of the men in quitting was a surprise to the management, as the delay in signing the scale is attributed to the absence of the general manager. A speedy settlement is expected when he returns home.

Locomotive Blows Up. Erie, Pa., Aug. 26.—While ascending a heavy grade about two miles west of Girard the crown sheet of a Lake Shore locomotive on a west bound freight train blew out, fatally scalding Engineer Charles Albright of Buffalo and Fireman J. W. Burns of Ashtabula, O., and terribly burning brakeman Ralph Clary of Collingwood, O. The men were blown clear out of the locomotive cab. The train continued to run, and the rest of the crew know nothing of the terrible accident until they saw from the engine windows the bodies of their fellow employees lying along the tracks.


