**Chase After a Daring Burglar**  
One of the most exciting pictures of the Lyman H. Howe exhibition to be seen in Barre opera house Friday night, Sept. 11, is that showing a chase after a daring burglar in England. The burglar leads the policeman over the streets of a city, across a mountain into a railway station, murdering two people in his flight. He escapes on a train but the officer telegraphs ahead and he is captured at another station after a desperate struggle. This is one of the interesting animated scenes to be shown.

**Triple Suicide in Philadelphia.**  
Philadelphia, Sept. 7.—The bodies of Mrs. Rosa Leisy, thirty-five years old, and her two children, Gottfried, sixteen years, and Mary, fifteen years, were found by the police in their home on Germantown avenue. The mother and son were lying on a couch clasped in each other's arms, and the daughter's body was found lying on three chairs at the foot of the couch. The police and coroner's investigation developed the fact that the woman and her children had died from poisoning. It is believed the family agreed to end their lives together. A brother of the dead woman expressed the opinion that fear of her husband, from whom she was divorced, was the cause of the act. The family was not in want, as Mrs. Leisy had a small account with a local trust company.

**Connecticut's Big Storm.**  
New Haven, Conn., Sept. 7.—The electric storm of exceeding severity that swept across the state of Connecticut left a trail of damage to growing crops and material property and caused at least two deaths and a railroad wreck. The railroad wreck was at Unionville, on the New Hartford branch of the Northampton division, New York and Hartford railroad, and resulted from a washout of the tracks. According to residents of that section, there was a cloudburst, accompanied by intense lightning. The train overturned and about a dozen persons injured, none seriously.

**Insane Patient Cruelly Treated.**  
Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Sept. 7.—Frank A. Sanders, an attendant in the Hudson River State Hospital for the Insane, has been held for the grand jury on the charge of assaulting John Hayes, a patient suffering from suicidal mania. Sanders is said to have confessed that while intoxicated he amused himself by tickling the feet and ribs of Hayes and pulling his nose. He is also charged with striking the patient and blackening his eyes.

**Munroe to Fight Jeffries.**  
New York, Sept. 7.—Jack Munroe has announced that he has telegraphed to James J. Jeffries an acceptance of his challenge to fight him for the championship at Los Angeles on Oct. 18.

### WILL HELP ST. LOUIS BANKS.

Secretary Shaw to Relieve Strain Caused by the Exposition. Chicago, Sept. 7.—During Secretary Shaw's visit to Chicago while on his way to Deadwood, S. D., to attend the meeting of the American Mining company he announced that he had taken action to relieve the St. Louis banks from the strain incident to expenditures on account of the Louisiana Purchase exposition. Asked as to what action he had taken, Secretary Shaw said:

"The banks at St. Louis have advanced directly probably \$3,000,000 of the \$10,000,000 expended upon the exposition grounds and buildings and indirectly nearly the entire amount. In addition to this they have advanced \$2,000,000 or \$3,000,000 to concessionaires. They are now facing the annual demand for money to move the crops in the southwest and are shipping out from \$200,000 to \$500,000 per day. The government in a certain sense has accepted a copartnership interest in the exposition. At least it has appropriated \$5,000,000 to aid the exposition. This is available only to meet the current expenditures.

"To relieve the present situation I have arranged to deposit \$2,500,000 in the banks at St. Louis. This would be to no advantage to the banks if they were compelled to purchase government bonds as security therefor. They have tried to borrow the bonds, but they are not available. In order to assist the banks such securities as the banks can furnish must be accepted. The banks can furnish such securities as the legislature of New York has approved for savings banks, and I have agreed to accept the same as security for the \$2,500,000 at 50 per cent of their par value.

"This, however, is intended as a temporary loan and will be gradually recalled as the \$5,000,000 appropriated is expended. The banks designated to receive \$500,000 each are the State National, Third National, Fourth National, National Bank of Commerce and Merchants' Laedie National."

### Ships Leave Portland.

Portland, Me., Sept. 5.—The training ship Alliance, gunboat Peoria and three torpedo boat destroyers, including the Lawrence, sailed from here, leaving the Topeka, Newport and one destroyer in the harbor at noon.


