Marconi's Visit to St. Louis.

They were called on by a party of world's fair officials, including President Francis and members of the executive, entertainment and electrical committees. They were taken in carriages to the St. Louis club, where a dinner was given in honor of Mr. Marconi. The visit of Marconi is for the purpose of consulting with the exposition officials in regard to the proposed establishment of a wireless telegraph station on the site.

Death of William Goldie.
