THE WAY TO BROIL.

Meat needs plenty of flare, fish but little.

Beef an inch thick will require from fifteen to twenty minutes' broiling.

Grease the bars of the gridiron with suet or kitchen fat, never with butter.

Trim off the skin from mutton chops, leave only fat enough to make them palatable and broil about ten minutes.

A hot, clear fire is indispensable. The gridiron should be scrupulously clean and heated thoroughly before the broil is put on it.

Put meat so near the fire that it will be in the flare which the fat drops cause. As soon as the surface on one side is browned turn and brown the other side. After this turn frequently and remove a little from the fire to finish cooking.
