## KING OF PACERS.

Previous Performances of the Famous Campaigner, Prince Alert. Prince Alert, the king of pacers and harness horses, is a bay gelding about 15.2 hands high, says the New York Herald. He was foaled in 1892 at Knightstown, Ind., where he was bred and raised by G. W. Fort. Crown Prince, his sire, was an unregistered crossroads stock horse by Artemas, a well bred son of Rysdyk's Hambletonian. Crown Prince's dam was by Young Proud American, a horse of practically unknown blood. Prince Alert's dam, Till, was of totally unknown breeding, so that the great pacer traces straight to the woods in every line except that running back to Artemas, the full brother of the noted old time trotting mare Orange Girl, 2:20.

As a campaigner Prince Alert began at the bottom of the ladder, racing for small purses on half mile tracks. He paced four races as a three-year-old, gaining a record of 2:15 1/4. At four he started ten times and cut his record down to 2:12 1/4. In his five-year-old form he competed in sixteen races, again reducing his record, this time to 2:07 1/4. In 1898, when six years old, he took part in fifteen contests of heats and closed the season with a mark of 2:07 1/4. Fourteen races and a mark of 2:05 1/4 made up his record in the campaign of 1899. In 1900 he paced seven races and set his record at 2:02. Starting nine times in 1901, he trained on to a record of 2:00 1/4, and in 1902 he made it "even time" by pacing a mile in 2:00 at Memphis, Tenn., at the wind up of a campaign of twelve starts. In 1903 he has started six times.

In his nine years on the turf Prince Alert has thus started ninety times and in each campaign has improved on his best previous performance. He has won more than one-half of all the races in which he has taken part. His record as a campaigner is unparalleled in the history of harness racing.

Prince Alert belongs to James Hanley of Providence, who has owned him several years.
