American Type Foundry Closed.
Chicago, Sept. 30.—Type foundry employed by the American Type Foundry company and Barnhart Bros. & Spindler have been called on a strike as part of a national move for the "closed shop." The plant of the American company was shut down. The fight between the type foundry union and employers, which began last spring, promises to be warmly contested, the strikers being allied with the International Typographical union, which will be asked for aid.
