**A Great Car Ferry.**  
The new Grand Trunk railway car ferry which will run between Grand Haven, Mich., and Milwaukee, Wis. is one of the largest and fastest ferries in the United States. It is 315 feet long, 54 feet beam and is moved along at 17 miles an hour by 4,000 horse power engines. It will carry twenty-three 30 ton cars. It will also have 32 state rooms for passengers.
