TO MARK MINERS' GRAVES.

Pioneer's Plan to Erect Headstones Over Their Last Resting Places. The will of James Lamb, a pioneer, who died a few days ago at Orville, Cal., leaves the bulk of his fortune of \$20,000 as a fund for the erection of a stone to mark the resting places of old miners who may hereafter die in Butte county.

The pioneers who helped to make history for California are fast passing away. Many are indigent and friendless. Their former wealth has been squandered or spent in exploiting new diggings, and now they are coming in from their lonely cabins in the gulches and on the bars to the county infirmary. From this time on their graves will be marked. James Lamb was a typical pioneer, but found himself with a competence when he was unable to work. He left \$4,500 to friends and the rest to mark the graves of his fellow pioneers.
