HOMES FOR EX-SLAVES.

Georgia Plan to Care For Old Negro Servants of Antebellum Days.

Moses Bentley, colored, has secured an option on 201 acres of land three miles east of Constitution, Ga., and one and one-half miles from East lake, where it is his intention to establish log cabin homes for old negro slaves, says the Atlanta Constitution. It is the intention of Moses Bentley to establish a colonization of these old negroes and furnish a sufficient amount of work in the way of truck farming to make the colony self supporting so far as possible. This movement has been carefully considered and indorsed by a number of prominent citizens. It is the present intention to provide homes for the old negro slaves of Georgia first, and then later for as many throughout the south as is possible.

This matter of providing some suitable home for old slaves has received much attention during the last few years and especially lately. Many of those in a position to know are of the opinion that it is only in the establishment of some such colony as the one proposed, where, in separate log cabins, the old slaves will be provided with homes of their own, that the scheme can be made practical. The matter of establishing a great home where the old slaves could live together has been found to be impracticable owing to the peculiar characteristics of these people, but it is believed that in the establishment of a lot of log cabins the greatest difficulties in this way will be obviated and the problem more practically solved than in any other way.

Many of the chapters of the Daughters of the Confederacy have also taken the matter of providing some suitable shelter for the old time negroes under consideration.

SMART RURAL POSTMASTER

Unique Method to Increase the Receipts of His Office.

A. A. Moser of Ruble, near Uniontown, Pa., during the recent political campaign used a unique method to increase the receipts of his office. He was assistant secretary of the Prohibition county committee and postmaster at Ruble, a remote town with fifty inhabitants and two miles from a railroad. Mr. Moser subscribed \$100 to the campaign fund. The Prohibitionists started on a strenuous campaign. Thousands of letters and circulars were sent broadcast and the letters dated Uniontown, but all bore the postmark of Ruble.

So great was the increase in the Ruble office receipts that the postal authorities wrote to ask the cause, but Mr. Moser was proceeding legally and explained clearly his case. He received the commission on the extra business and was materially benefited, and when the votes were counted on the state ticket the Prohibitionists had in Mr. Moser's election district forty-seven, or one more than Republicans and Democrats combined.

Priest Strangely Missing.

New York, Nov. 16.—The Rev. Giuseppe Cirrignone, a young Italian priest who is pastor of a little church in Williamsbridge, in the northern part of New York city, is strangely missing from his home, and from threats received by him that if he did not deliver \$3,000 he would suffer the penalty his friends believe that he has been abducted and perhaps murdered.

Jew Batters' Trials.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 16.—About 3,000 witnesses and fifty lawyers will appear at the trial, which opens Thursday next, of the persons arrested on the charge of participation in the massacre of Jews at Kishineff in April last. All the mayors, marshals and nobles of Bessarabia will sit in judgment on the prisoners.

Royal Visitor For Us!

Berlin, Nov. 16.—A dispatch to the Tagblatt from Kiel says the imperial yacht Hohenzollern has been made ready to go to sea in February. Her destination is announced to be North America, but what personage will sail on her has not been made known.

Sixteen Hundred Out of Work.

Chicago, Nov. 16.—The men employed in the bar mill of the Inland Steel company at Indiana Harbor have refused to accept a reduction of 12 1/2 per cent in their wages, and the entire plant is shut down. About 1,600 men are thrown out of employment.
