THE TREATY IS SIGNED

Perpetual Lease of Panama Land

FOR ISTHMIAN CANAL

United States Will Have Complete Jurisdiction Over Canal Strip and Terminal Cities.

Washington, Nov. 10.—Secretary Hay and M. Philippe Bunau-Varilla, the minister from Panama, at 4:40 o'clock this evening, signed the Hay-Bunau-Varilla treaty providing for the construction of the Panama canal by the United States.

The keynote of the treaty is the provision by which Panama cedes to the United States whatever land or lands throughout the republic of Panama this government shall find desirable in connection with the building or the operation and maintenance of the canal.

In general it may be said that while the new treaty contains many of the provisions of the failed Hay-Herran treaty, it is not based on that convention, but follows not only the spirit but the letter of the Spooner act.

MAN BLOWN INTO ATOMS

St. Albans, Nov. 10.—The Robin Hood Powder company's plant at Swanton blew up with terrific force at 2 o'clock this afternoon, killing one man and completely wrecking and destroying the plant.

The force of the explosion was terrific, buildings rocked on their foundations all over the village and glass was smashed from windows by the concussion.

The powder manufacturing plant of the company, which was destroyed, consisted of five buildings, all of which were blown to pieces or burned up. The trouble started in what is known as the mixing department, in which but one man, Blair, happened to be working at the time.
