Chicago, Nov. 21.—The law and medical department of Northwestern university has narrowly escaped destruction. The flames started from a defective electric wire on the fourth floor of the building, which was formerly the Tremont House, and after burning out a lecture room crept up an elevator shaft to the seventh floor, where a clinic room was destroyed. The loss is \$10,000.

### COLLINS RENOMINATED.

For Mayor of Boston—Swallow the Republican Candidate. Boston, Nov. 21.—Complete returns from the city primaries show that Patrick A. Collins was renominated for mayor by the Democrats by a plurality of 19,474 over his opponent, Fred S. Gore, and that George N. Swallow was nominated for mayor by the Republicans by a plurality of 3,154 over Michael J. Murray and a plurality of 3,802 over D. R. H. Gensey, his two contestants for the nomination. The total vote of Mayor Collins was 30,094 and of Candidate Swallow 6,363.

What proved to be the most interesting feature of the primaries was the exciting race for the nomination at the hands of the Republicans for street commissioner between Andrew J. Sullivan and Isaac B. P. Allen, the latter being a well known negro politician. Mr. Sullivan finally won by the narrow margin of four votes, his total being 5,319. James A. Gallivan, the Democratic nominee, was unopposed for a renomination.

### Fifteen Hundred Homeless.

Mexico City, Nov. 21.—The fire at Vera Cruz destroyed seven blocks of dwellings, leaving 1,500 people homeless. Nearly all the victims of the fire were poor people, the commercial interests of the port not being affected.

### Colorado Mayor Arrested.

Trinidad, Colo., Nov. 21.—The mayor, marshal and other city officials of Hastings were arrested on complaint of the striking mine workers, charged with false arrest of the officials of the mine workers. They were brought to Trinidad and gave bonds.

### Preferential Trade Bill Passed.

Wellington, N. Z., Nov. 21.—The upper house has passed the preferential trade bill.

### Julia Came and Went.

In 1831 an island which received the baptismal name of Julia appeared off the south coast of Sicily. After an earthly existence of just two months it was again received into the deep, which had given and then taken away. Soundings which were taken at the spot showed a depth of fifty meters.

### A Chinese Edict.

During a rebellion in China in 1833 an imperial edict was issued at Peking ordering officials to destroy all sulphur deposits, to prevent insurgents from obtaining material for gunpowder. As these deposits were chiefly active volcanic craters, the officials had their hands full.
