THE ALEXANDRETTA AFFAIR

Government Will Not Send Vessel to Consul Davis' Port. Washington, Dec. 11. - Unless the state department receives further advice from Consul Davis, who had some trouble with the police of Alexandretta, Asiatic Turkey, which would place the matter in a more serious light, it is not the intention of the navy department to send a vessel to that port. The Mediterranean fleet at Beirut is now under orders to proceed with its target practice, as originally planned, but the movement of the fleet toward the West Indies is to be deferred for a brief period. This is interpreted here to mean that while the present understanding is not to have one of the ships go to Alexandretta it has been deemed advisable to keep the squadron in eastern Mediterranean waters a short time longer for any emergency that may arise growing out of the Davis affair. The Brooklyn and San Francisco soon will leave Beirut for Port Said, where they will take on a quantity of stores, the supply ship Alexander having already arrived there with them.
