Missionary Murdered in Liberia.

Washington, Dec. 30.—Minister Lyon has reported to the state department from Monrovia, Liberia, under date of Nov. 4 last, the details of the massacre in the depths of an African forest of a white missionary named John G. Tate, with all of his following, eighteen in number. It appears that the massacre took place as far back as March 15, 1901, yet this, the first detailed account, has just come to hand in an affidavit by Mrs. Mary L. Allen, a white missionary at Nouna Kroo, Liberia. She had the story from some of the native Dog tribesmen, who knew of the killing.

To Study Filthier Germs.

San Francisco, Dec. 30.—Professor Maximilian Herzog is in this city en route to his field of labor in the Philippine Islands, to which he has been called by the United States government to study disease germs and investigate Asiatic maladies. Professor Herzog is professor of pathology and bacteriology in the Chicago polytechnic. He will sail on the Nippon Maru for the Philippines.
