HAVANA EXPRESS BURNED.

Passengers on Cuban Train Barely Save Their Lives.

Santiago, Cuba, April 2.—The Havana express on the Cuba railroad ran into the flames from one of the company's wood piles which was burning alongside the track east of Las Tunas. A sleeper, two coaches and an observation car were burned. The mail, baggage and express consignments were saved. No passengers were injured. The engine of the train discovered the fire on passing a curve and when it was impossible to stop the train. It attempted to speed through the flames from the burning ties, but they had caused the fire to spread, and consequently the train, which was crowded with passengers, was destroyed in the midst of 15 minutes.

Among the passengers was Teresa, the Cuban opera singer. All on board the train escaped by the sides of the cars which were not immediately exposed to the flames. A relief train brought all the passengers and the crew of the burnt cars.
