### Colorado Militiamen Appeal.

Denver, April 25.—Adjutant General Sherman M. Bell and Captain Buckley Welles have appealed to the supreme court for a writ of superadeas to stay the ruling of Judge Stevens of San Miguel county finding them guilty of contempt of court for failing to produce President Moyer of the Western Federation of Miners in response to the writ of habeas corpus issued by Judge Stevens.
