Blind Men In Revolt.
Five hundred and fifty inmates of the Blind Hospital of St. Joseph at Naples broke out in revolt recently because the management had published a regulation limiting the hours of outdoor exercise, says the Rome correspondent of the London Chronicle. A blind old man was posted in the Campanile to ring the signal bell for the outbreak, whereupon the malcontents swarmed through the windows. To prevent communication with the police they had barred the entrances and destroyed the telephone apparatus. They also tore up the gaspipes. One of the directors, who sought to summon aid, was forced to leap from the balcony on the second floor to escape the fury of the rebels. Some of the rioters were badly cut and bruised.
