The legal voters of the City of Barre are hereby warned and notified to meet in City Meeting in the Opera House, in the City of Barre, Vt., on Tuesday, the 12th day of July, 1904, at 7:30 P. M., to transact the following business, viz:

First.—To elect a moderator to preside over said meeting.

Second.—To hear a report from the special committee appointed to make investigations and recommendations in reference to a new fire station.

Third.—To see if the city will vote to locate and erect a new fire station.

Fourth.—To see if the City will vote to purchase land or otherwise procure land upon which a fire station can be erected.

Fifth.—To see if the City will vote to give the City Council authority to select a site for said fire station, to purchase or procure land therefor, and to erect a building thereon.

Sixth.—To see if the City will vote to raise a special tax for the purpose of purchasing land for a new fire station, if necessary, and the erection of a building, and if so, how much.

Seventh.—To see if the City will vote to borrow money, and issue its bonds, notes, or orders, for the purchase of land, if necessary, for a new fire station, and the erection of a building thereon, and if so, how much.


Eighth.—To do any other proper business that may be properly introduced.
