INVALID GIRL MAIL CARRIER.

How Farmers Along Villa Potter's Route Make It Easy For Her.

If any one were to ask who is the most popular girl in Willow Grove, N. J., the prompt answer would be "Miss Villa Potter," and if any one asked who is the bravest girl in the state the answer would be the same, says a Vineland (N. J.) dispatch to the New York Press.

Miss Potter, although an invalid for eighteen years, is the United States mail carrier from Newfield, Gloucester county, to Perchtown and the surrounding country, her daily route covering nine miles. Her father, Michael, was killed by the caving in of a well several years ago, and her brother Frank carried the mail. When he died Miss Potter determined to do something to help her mother, though she is unable to walk, and put in an application for the place made vacant by the death of her brother. Neighbors heard of her intention, and never was there a more generally signed petition sent out from Vineland. So Miss Potter received the appointment.

Every morning Mrs. Potter wheels the girl in her invalid chair out to the mail wagon and assists her to get in. Then Villa gathers up the lines, clucks cheerfully to the horse and is away on her long and lonely drive. Rain or shine she is as punctual as travel by wagon can be, and everywhere there are a smile and a wave of the hand for Villa, who is as proud as she can be at being able to aid her mother.

The farmers along the route as one man moved all the mail boxes to trees close to the road, so the girl need not leave her wagon. If there were no trees handy, they sunk posts. Thus all is made as easy as possible for the United States mail carrier.
