

JAP'S CONSCIENCE MONEY

Premonition of Death Caused Karoti to Pay for Stolen Ride.
President Earling of the Milwaukee railroad received an interesting letter not long ago from one of the soldiers of the Mikado's army, says a St. Paul dispatch to the St. Louis Post-Dispatch. The letter is as follows:

Most illustrious Sir—Your humble servant, in the expectation of death, desires to make restitution to you for the money having been accomplished by him, while he was living in that grand America. When the Second corps of the army was mobilized at Tokyo I, Matsuda Karoti, was in Chicago. I was without dollars, and the hurry to arrive at home was great to me. I therefore took a piece of plank and inserted it in on the rods of one of your most illustrious chair cars.

Thus I arrived in St. Paul last October. I had much trouble on the ride, but when here my noble friends in Japan already for my passage money had sent, and I did not have to use my board any further than St. Paul.

Tomorrow this battalion moves on the road of the oppressive foe, and, while I know the army of the emperor cannot fail, I shall die.

I, Matsuda Karoti, of the samurai, do wish to free my mind of the weight of its guilt in stealing from your most magnificent railroad a ride, and therefore do I send to you in the money of my noble emperor, which makes about the fare from Chicago to St. Paul. Your humble slave. MATSUDA KAROTI. Eighth Imperial Battalion of the Second Corps. Near Yinkow, July 2, 1904.

The letter was referred to General Passenger Agent Miller and by him to Northwestern Passenger Agent Dixon. No news was developed to indicate whether the soldier fell when Oku's army took the Russian outposts July 4 at Yinkow, although the officials took the trouble to wire to the Japanese legation at Washington to find out if any officer by the name of Matsuda Karoti had been reported killed in the charge.

The officials say that the restitution of the amount of a first class fare under any circumstances by the conscience stricken is extremely unusual and that for a soldier to do so is almost unknown.

The 30 yen has been turned into the treasury of the road.

Perfume From Philippine Flower.
"America has the monopoly of the finest perfume in the world," said a well known chemist of Paris, according to a cable dispatch. "Despite our reputation in that line we French have nothing to beat the yang-yang. The integral parts of that perfume, a vegetable oil, are found in their highest perfection only in the Philippines. But it takes twenty pounds of flowers to distill two grains of the oil. It appears that the Yankees have not yet caught on to the good thing in their hands, which is a wonder, seeing that yang-yang is enormously popular."
