Folkestone, England, Sept. 8.—Burgess, the French swimming champion, who, accompanied by the English swimmer Weidman, made an ineffectual attempt on Tuesday to swim the channel, has started again from Cop point, just east of Folkestone.

Steel Prices Cut.

New York, Sept. 8.—It is reported that steel billets have been reduced in price from \$23 to \$19 a ton, and the report is generally credited in steel circles, although it is impossible to find any official of the Steel corporation who would confirm or deny the report.
