ABOUT THE STATE.

Items of Interest Gleaned From Our Exchanges.

A. A. Bliss of Calais has in his possession two continental bills dated 1778, each being a \$30 bill. They have been well preserved and are in good shape.

Mrs. Jeremiah Curtin, wife of the translator of "Quo Vadis," left Bristol Tuesday for New York where she will take a steamer for Europe to join Mr. Curtin, and pass the winter.

A black bear weighing 202 pounds was shot on Miles mountain in Concord early Sunday morning by two deer hunters. This is the second bear killed in that town within a week, as a bear weighing 150 pounds was killed by two other men Thursday.

Judge M. E. Tucker of Lowell, is the owner of the asbestos mine in that town. He has had many experts examine the property and they unite in calling it a paying property. The United States geological survey has examined the property and reports that the mine has the best showing of any similar deposit in the country. Mr. Tucker has opened the mine and is ready to erect buildings and set up the necessary machinery. He has had many applications for shares of stock but has refused them all. His plan is to form a partnership rather than a stock company.

Windham maintains her reputation as a potato producing town this year, giving some very large yields. The official measurement of the Grange gave the yield of J. M. Eastman's field at the rate of 48 bushels of merchantable potatoes to the acre, with 37 bushels of non-marketable ones. J. B. Fontaine is reported as having a yield of over 800 bushels to the acre. F. H. Robbins planted two potatoes of the Sir Walter Raleigh variety from which he reports a yield of 3 1/2 bushels. W. S. Montrop dug a single potato which weighed three pounds and one ounce.

The trustees under the will of Thomas Thompson have taken proper action to prevent colonizing in Brattleboro by people who hope to become beneficiaries of the Thompson fund. For the present no additions will be made to the number of seamstresses, needle-women and shop girls who will be regarded as entitled to special aid in case of need from sickness, want of employment, or misfortune, and that the money of the trust used in Brattleboro, and not required to meet cases of temporary need among those already established in these occupations, will be used in accordance with the terms of the will for "kindred charitable purposes."
