ABOUT THE STATE.

Items of Interest Gleaned from Our Exchanges.

Basket ball enthusiasts throughout the State will be interested to know that a game has been arranged between the St. Johnsbury Academy and Burlington high school teams, to be played on the floor of the University of Vermont gymnasium Friday evening of this week, to decide the basket ball championship of the preparatory schools of the State.

William McNason of Morrisville, was the victim of an accident recently by which he lost the sight of his right eye. He was engaged in making a wood road, when a chip flew from a stump on which he was chopping, striking the right eye and destroying the sight. He went to the Fanny Allen hospital, Winooski park, to receive treatment in the hope of saving the left eye.

Sunday marked the close of the Rev. George W. Morrow's term of office as superintendent of the Vermont Anti-Saloon League. He spoke in Underhill, Mr. Morrow, since his resignation from the office of superintendent of the league in this state, has been working jointly with his successor, C. J. Ferguson.
