ABOUT THE STATE.

Items of Interest Gleaned from Our Exchange.

District No. 3, Order of Eastern Star, will hold its annual convocation with Rising Sun Chapter, No. 12, O. E. S., in Masonic hall at South Royalton May 5.

H. L. Cook & Co., of Berlin, N. H., has purchased the machine shop and foundry owned and operated by A. Aubin, of West Derby, taking possession immediately.

Owing to the serious clay slides in the cut near the Waterbury depot, the cars on the Mount Mansfield Electric road are unable to come further than Colbyville. Stages, however, complete the trip.

A cow owned by Tuesen Terrien of Richmond, recently gave birth to a calf having only three legs. The calf is otherwise perfectly formed and smart. The missing member is one of the fore legs. Mr. Terrien will keep it for awhile at least.

The three-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. William Call, of Richmond, died recently and candles which were left burning by the bedside where the body was laid out in some manner set some of the bed clothing on fire. The flames were extinguished but not before the body of the dead child had been somewhat burned and scorched.

M. F. Preston of Randolph is suffering from very sore hands that threaten to develop blood poison. About two weeks ago, a cat bit him in the palm of the left hand at the base of the forefinger and the resulting inflammation, which has spread over his hand, causing him intense suffering. On the second finger of the right hand he removed a wart with a knife that had not been properly sterilized and the wound has made the whole finger swell and pain him badly.

A pit constructed by Samuel Geno in Rutland City Park for the disposal of the city's rubbish is now in use. The pit is constructed of steel and is not unlike a huge vertical boiler as regards its outside appearance. It is seven feet in diameter, and 12 feet high, with an 18-inch stack 50 feet in height. In this pit it is intended that all inflammable material in the city's rubbish shall be burned, and residents of the city having rubbish to burn are expected to have it conveyed to the pit.

William Waterman, of East Charleston, was fined \$5 and costs in Island Pond April 10 for intoxication. Being a minor he was compelled to disclose where he obtained the liquor, and his disclosure implicated Lester Sewer, also of East Charleston. Sewer was arrested, charged with illegal furnishing, pleaded not guilty, and was held in bonds of \$500 for trial at the October term of the county court. Waterman was held in the same amount for appearance as witness.
