



## CONGREGATIONALISTS MEET.

110th Annual Meeting of State Society Is Being Held.

Brattleboro, June 14.—The one hundred and tenth annual meeting of the Congregational Convention of Vermont was opened here yesterday. Over two hundred delegates were present including those to the Woman's Home Missionary Union and the Vermont Domestic Missionary Society.

The morning session was devoted to the Woman's Home Missionary Union, the president, Mrs. Rebecca Fairbanks, of St. Johnsbury, presiding. The report of the secretary, Mrs. Evan Thomas, of Essex Junction, showed a gain of one hundred and forty-one in membership.

These officers were elected: President, Mrs. Rebecca Fairbanks, of St. Johnsbury; vice-president, Mrs. Edward G. Osgood, of Bellows Falls; recording secretary, Mrs. Evan Thomas, of Essex Junction; corresponding secretary, Mrs. John B. Stearns, of Burlington; secretary of young people's work, Miss Mary Drew, of Waterbury; secretary of junior work, Mrs. Robert MacKinnon, of St. Johnsbury; treasurer, Mrs. Charles E. Thompson, of Brattleboro; assistant treasurer, Miss Ellen L. Ware, of Brattleboro; auditor, the Rev. H. R. Miles, of Brattleboro.

The convention sermon was preached yesterday afternoon by the Rev. Francis A. Poole, of Barre.

## CONTRACT AWARDED.

Ethan Allen Memorial Tower Will Cost \$1,800.

Burlington, June 14.—The contract for constructing the memorial tower to Ethan Allen at Indian Rock has been awarded by the building committee of the Sons of the American Revolution to the Champlain Manufacturing company for \$1,800.

Work will be begun at once and the tower will be completed by August 15, when it will be dedicated in connection with elaborate exercises in commemoration of Bennington battle day.


The design for the tower is of a bold military order and will be very fitting and appropriate for the purpose. The dimensions are 40 feet high, 24 feet square at the base and 20 feet at the narrow part, the battlements being wide enough so that the top corresponds in size with the base. It will be built of stone, part of which will be quarried near the spot, as there is an excellent opportunity to obtain it close by the proposed site. The outer layer of stone will be secured from the Phelps quarries.

## A Marshfield Suit.

Marshfield, June 14.—The attorney of Mrs. Alex Spicer is taking affidavits for presentation to Judge Loveland Munson of the supreme bench, for an order to make Alex Spicer, the husband, support the petitioner. This petition is contested on the ground that the petitioner has been, and is, ready to support his wife provided she will live with him. Today is allowed to the petitioner in which to secure her affidavits. One day will be allowed to the petitioner for the same purpose and one day will be devoted to rebuttal. The evidence thus gathered will be presented to Judge Munson in the form of a petition that he will allow or disallow a hearing before the supreme court. Divorce proceedings are pending in this case. Fred L. Laird appears for Alex Spicer; J. P. Lamson represents Mrs. Spicer.


