Items of Interest Gleaned from Our Exchanges. The Rev. C. D. R. Mencham has accepted a unanimous call to his old parsonage in Townshend. At the same time he received a unanimous call to become pastor of the church in Jamaica, but preferred his former field of labor. Dr. Mary Platt, of Shoreham, has announced her intention of building a library for a memorial to her late husband, Dr. William N. Platt, which she is to present to the town when completed. It will be made of brick and heated by a furnace.

An elm tree, estimated to be over one hundred years old and standing at the corner of Main and Safford streets, Bennington, was recently cut down. While chopping through the heart of the tree the axe came in contact with a hand forged nail that must have been driven into the tree nearly a century ago.

The Advent Christian church at St. Johnsbury has secured the services of the Rev. John W. Evans as its pastor. Mr. Evans is at the present time treasurer of the A. A. Mission society in Boston. He has preached among the New England churches as an itinerant for several years, but this is his first charge.

It has just been discovered that a young man who solicited subscriptions in Rutland about two weeks ago for The Success Magazine is an imposter. The young man represented himself as a vivinity student and said that he was working his way through college. He claimed to be studying at the University of Vermont. An interesting addition to the museum of the public library at Bellows Falls has recently been made in the shape of a valuable mineral specimen. It was given by Mrs. Mary L.
