SHOOTS DOWN OLD MAN.

New Brunswick Hunter Fires Without Investigating.

St. John, N. B., Nov. 18.—Mistaken for a moose, William Kinkade, an aged resident of the Narrows, some distance up the St. John river, was fatally shot by a hunter. Word was received here yesterday of the affair, which occurred on Wednesday. Kinkade was 70 years of age, and was chopping in the woods near his home, with his son, Chester.

After a time the old man went into an old woodshed, while the son started off in a different direction to work on another lot. Suddenly Chester heard a shot, in the direction in which his father was working. He hastened to the spot, fearing some accident. The aged man lay dead on the ground. A rifle bullet had pierced his heart.

A moment later Stanley E. Anvoy, a resident of the vicinity, pushed his way through the woods to the little clearing where Kinkade had been chopping. Anjoy stated that he had been hunting and seeing movements among the trees thought they were made by a moose. He fired, and Kinkade fell.

No action has been taken against Anjoy, but arrangements have been made for the holding of an inquest.

Shot a Cow While Hunting.

In a hearing of the case brought by Mrs. Orsola Zaccan, of West Dummerston, against Jack Imperia for shooting the woman's cow while out hunting, the defendant failed to appear. The plaintiff sued for \$50 and was represented by A. F. Schwenk of Brattleboro. Frank E. Barber represented his trustee.

Brattleboro, Nov. 18.—Dr. Edward R. Lynch, one of Brattleboro's well known physicians, was arrested yesterday by Deputy Sheriff F. W. McClure on a state's attorney's complaint charging the doctor with criminal abortion. Dr. Lynch was to have been taken to Bellows Falls by the officer, but Attorney E. W. Gibson notified the state's attorney by telephone that his client would appear there next Tuesday when the hearing will take place.

State's Attorney Ryder said he did not wish to make public any of the facts of the case until after the hearing. He did say, however, that the woman in the case was a resident of Brattleboro and intimated that the evidence against the local physician was sufficient to hold him without doubt. The hearing was set for Bellows Falls, Mr. Ryder said, for the reason that most of the witnesses can reach that town easier than Brattleboro.
