Items of Interest Gleaned From Our Exchanges.

The height above sea level of the new weather bureau at Burlington is being determined this week. The surveyor, Prof. L. R. Jones, started with a point near the city hall which was determined by the U. S. geological survey several years ago to be 208 feet above sea level.

A record-breaking pine tree was taken to Rutland recently by H. V. Hewitt of Shrewsbury and sold to the Stoddard Manufacturing company. The log, which was drawn by six horses, was 36 feet long and measured 28 inches at the butt and 14 inches at the tip. The tree was said to be 114 feet high while standing.

E. L. Hastings has resigned his position as station agent for the Central Vermont railway at Townsend. Mr. Hastings has been in the employ of the Central Vermont for over 25 years, having been at his post since the first train was run Nov. 15, 1885, with the exception of the months of July and August, 1905, when he and his wife journeyed to the Pacific coast.
