

EXPECT BIG STRIKE.

Trolley Men of Eastern Massachusetts Preparing for One.

Boston, Mass., April 4.—Eastern Massachusetts may be the scene of a big street car men's strike next month. All the efforts and resources of the International Amalgamated Union of Street and Railway Men are now being devoted to bettering the condition of the members of the best unions in this vicinity. The unions include all the men employed on the Boston & Northern and Old Colony systems of the Massachusetts Electric company.

A work day of nine hours within eleven hours at a flat rate of 28 cents, an hour on or before May 1 are the wages and conditions demanded by the state convention of the street railway men's unions. The scale will be presented to President Sullivan of the Massachusetts Electric company at once, and at the same time a request will be made for a conference.

The unions have the systems completely organized and include in their membership about every street car man in eastern Massachusetts and southern New Hampshire, except those on the Boston elevated system.
