### COLLEGE AND SCHOOL.

Mrs. Louisa N. Bullard has made a gift to the Harvard Medical school of \$50,000 for the establishing of a professorship of neurophysiology.

A new liquid air plant lately designed by Professor W. P. Bradley of Wesleyan university has been installed in the chemical laboratory of Boylston hall at Harvard.

Dr. Lester F. Ward, who has long been connected with the United States geological survey and the National museum and is eminent for his contributions both to sociology and to paleontology, has been elected professor of sociology at Brown university.

Bliss Perry, editor of the Atlantic Monthly, has been appointed to a professorship in English literature in Harvard college, a chair which has remained vacant since 1896 and which before that time was occupied by George Ticknor, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow and James Russell Lowell.

The liability of an employer to an employee for injuries caused by negligence in the handling of a boiler upon the premises by a co-employee, an engineer who is conceded to have been competent, is denied in *Service versus Shoneman* (Pa.), 60 L. R. A. 792.

The liability of a husband for the support of his wife at an asylum for the insane, to which she has been removed by due process of law, is denied in *Richardson versus Stuesser* (Wis.), 60 L. R. A. 829, in the absence of an agreement to that effect is fully executed and the discharge is evidenced by a written receipt for the lesser sum in full satisfaction of the greater sum.
