

PARIS STRIKERS WEAKENING.

Further Evidence of Disruption, Although Several Trades Are Firm.

Paris, May 4.—The general strike shows further evidence of disruption, but a number of trades are still refusing to return to work until their demands are granted.

A squadron of dragons is drawn up in the courtyard of the Prince Eugene barracks, on the Place de la Republique, prepared to respond to any call of the police. The latter continue to be massed in considerable force in the neighborhood of the Labor Exchange, and occasional arrests are made, but there is no disorder.

Place de la Republique, the late storm center, was yesterday transformed into the regular Thursday flower market, with acres of violets and geraniums, the crowds of women buyers far exceeding the strikers in numbers.

FOUND MURDERED IN BUSHES.

Dead Man Had Envelope Addressed to Q. P. Bunch, Fort Smith, Ark.

Washington, Pa., May 3.—With the skull crushed and the features mutilated the body of an unknown man was found near the tracks of the Wabash road in a clump of bushes about fifteen miles from here.

A blood-stained rock that apparently had been used with which the murder was committed was found near by. The only clue by which identification may be possible is an envelope found in the pockets of the dead man, addressed to Q. P. Bunch, R. F. D. No. 3, Fort Smith, Ark. In the pockets were also found specimens of gold and silver quartz. It is thought the man was a prospector.

KILLS FOUR MEN.

Falling Derrick at Quarry in Rockland, Me. Fatal.

Rockland, Me., May 3.—Four men were killed yesterday by the falling of the derrick in the Union Hardrock Lime-quarry. The dead are as follows: Fred C. Pear, 30, Rockland; leaves a widow and children. Charles Colson, a Swede, 37, Thomaston; leaves a widow. John Kelleher, 45, Thomaston; unmarried. Edward Giras, 34, Rockland; leaves widow and child.
