NEILL TELLS

Says He Was Asked To Make No Report and Give Packers TIME TO CLEAN PLACES UP

Sensation in Committee—President Investigator Declares Forcibly That Everything in Report Is True.

Washington, June 8.—Dr. Charles P. Neill, commissioner of labor, who with James B. Reynolds prepared the report for President Roosevelt that showed revolting conditions in the Chicago packing plants, caused a sensation yesterday when he appeared before the House committee on agriculture.

Very many conditions, Dr. Neill held, were due simply to negligence. In some of the rooms conditions were unacceptably bad. Rooms were found in which meat products were being prepared where there had been no water for weeks, and where filth was caked on the floor.

CLERK WHO GOT \$47,000 IS FIRED

Boyer Dismissed From Service of the Pennsylvania

ANOTHER WEALTHY ONE

Philadelphia, June 8.—The investigation by the Interstate Commerce Commission, which was resumed again yesterday morning, brought to light another clerk in the employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad who, on a salary ranging from \$30 to \$120 a month during the past thirty years has saved enough money to put about \$50,000 into coal stocks, which are now worth nearly \$100,000.
