**OFFICERS FOR VERMONT DAMES.**  
Elected at Annual Meeting in Montpelier Yesterday.  
Montpelier, Oct. 19.—The Vermont Society of Colonial Dames met in the Wood Art gallery yesterday for the ninth annual meeting, 113 of the 285 members being in attendance. Mrs. Wallace C. Clement of Rutland, the president, was in the chair.

The following officers were elected: President, Mrs. E. Stewart Stranahan of St. Albans; first vice president, Mrs. Wallace C. Clement of Rutland; third vice president, Mrs. Albert Tuttle of Fair Haven; fourth vice president, Mrs. Clayton N. North of Shorttland; recording secretary, Miss Jennie A. Valentine of Bennington; corresponding secretary, Miss Mary F. Cooke of Westley, Mass.; treasurer, Miss Mary M. Tuttle of Fair Haven; historian, Mrs. A. E. Leavenworth of Castleton; first member of the board of management, Mrs. Edward C. Smith of St. Albans; third member of board of management, Mrs. A. W. Ferrin of Montpelier.

It was voted to take some action toward marking the grave of John Robinson, one of the Pilgrim Fathers, buried in an unmarked grave at Leyden, Holland.  
On motion of Mrs. F. S. Stranahan, it was voted to appoint a committee to take some action regarding the 300th anniversary of the discovery of Lake Champlain and the following committee was named: Mrs. F. S. Stranahan of St. Albans, Mrs. C. N. North of Shoreham, and Mrs. C. E. Reime of Brattleboro.

**FOES TO ERROR.**  
Teachers' Army in Philippines Dealt Death to Old Superstitions.  
Lake Mohonk, N. Y., Oct. 18.—"The Philippines" was the subject discussed at the forenoon session of the Lake Mohonk conference of Friends of the Indians and Other Dependent Peoples. The conference adopted and ordered cabled to the Brussels conference a memorial calling for co-operation of Christian nations by treaties against intoxicants and opium traffic among uncivilized nations, in these words:  
"Mohonk conference, emphatically condemning the use of and the traffic in opium and intoxicants, most cordially indorses Senate resolutions of January 4, 1901.  
The Rev. Dr. John B. Deems of the New York Observer, the chief speaker, related in a number of personal experiences and reminiscences of his own religious services among the Filipinos.  
"The American teachers' army of invasion," said he, "and the right to think for themselves, was more terrible and more distinctive in their reign of superstition and ignorance than all the armies with the sword."  
McKinley Fund \$461,740.99.  
Secretary Hartzell Issues Report for the Association.  
Canton, O., Oct. 19.—Secretary Hartzell of the McKinley National Memorial association yesterday gave out a statement showing that the association has paid all the expenses since its organization, and has accumulated a profit of more than \$2,000 from interest in the meantime. The report shows total contributions of \$556,564.89, to which should be added profit on investments the sum of \$74,062.50, making the total of receipts \$630,627.39. There had been expended up to June 30 \$178,886.20, leaving on hand the sum of \$451,740.99.

**DRANK FURNITURE POLISH.**

One Man Dead and Another in Critical Condition at Peterborough, N. H.  
Peterborough, N. H., Oct. 18.—Chas. E. Derry is dead and William Dornett is in a critical state as the result of drinking furniture polish while on a spree. The two started on a spree on Tuesday, and as the town is a nuisance town, they were drinking all sorts of stuff to make the drunk come. After drinking Jamaica ginger and various other alcoholic tinctures, they got hold of a bottle of furniture polish and began drinking that. This sort of truck was too much for Derry and he was soon out of commission, and in spite of all that could be done he expired at 10 o'clock. His companion, Dornett, was a much stronger man and survives, though still in a critical state. The dead man leaves a wife, but no children. He was a native of Ludlow, Vt., and by trade was a wool spinner, though his occupation at the time of his death was that of a teamster. He had resided here for about five years, coming here from Hillsborough, where he had lived for seven years.

**CHANGE IN PANAMA PLAN.**  
A Governor, as Well as an American Minister, to Be Appointed.  
Washington, D. C., Oct. 19.—It was decided at the conference between the President and Secretary Taft yesterday to appoint a governor as well as an American minister for Panama, although the names of the persons selected have not yet been announced. Secretary Taft will not accompany the President on his trip to the isthmus.

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
