VERSATILE THIEF ARRESTED.

DALZELL IN DANGER

Fear of Defeat of Protection Congressman

BY THE "STRIKE MAYOR"

Says That Cortelyou Is Showing the Way to Make Assessment—Declares That Hearst Is Now Sure of Election.

Pittsburg, Pa., Oct. 27.—The protected interests in the new thirtieth congressional district fear the defeat of John Dalzell for re-election to Congress. The opponent of Dalzell is ex-Mayor R. J. Black of McKeesport, who is known as the "strike mayor." Black, who is a physician, was mayor of McKeesport during the last strike against the United States Steel corporation, and during that time endeavored himself to all forms of organized labor by announcing that he would arrest any man coming to McKeesport to take the place of the strikers.

LIQUOR SALE DRUNKEN MEN COSTS LICENSE

Excise Board Punishes John Flemming & Co. for Violation of Law—First Case on Record.

Boston, Oct. 27.—For the first time in its existence the Excise Board revoked the license of a Boston salaried for selling liquor to an intoxicated person. It was charged by Commissioner O'Meara and Captain Cain that the firm of John Flemming & Co. served liquor to a drunken man and afterward carried him to a vacant lot, where he was found unconscious. The Board said the offence was aggravated by the fact that the license holder had not been notified of the violation.

BOY EXPOSES A FAGIN.

Tells How He Was Taught to Pick Pockets.

New York, Oct. 27.—When Hyman Cassano, a fifteen-year-old lad, was arraigned in the children's court yesterday on a charge of picking pockets he not only admitted the charge, but wore that a man had taught him to steal and sent him out at five o'clock every morning to look for victims. The boy said his parents were dead and that he lived at 130 Ridge street with Harry Stein and the latter's wife.

RELIEF FOR POTATO SHIPPERS.

Maine Growers Receive First Installment of Cars.

Boulton, Me., Oct. 27.—Some relief is in sight for the farmers of Aroostook county, who have thousands of bushels of potatoes in storage and in danger of spoiling because freight cars could not be secured to transport the potatoes to market. The first installment of 250 cars, which are being built by the Canadian Pacific Railway company at its main shops in Montreal, have arrived and others are expected to follow gradually. The cars are to be used exclusively for the shipment of Aroostook potatoes. They are all lined, sealed and with double doors, and can be used for no other purpose than potatoes. They must be returned to Aroostook shippers as soon as unloaded.
