47 BURNED TO DEATH

In Train Wreck on Baltimore & Ohio R. R.

NEAR CHICAGO, YESTERDAY

More Than 80 Injured in Collision of Immigrant With Freight Train, Due to Defective Signals—People Roasted in Car Wreckage.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 12.—Forty-seven persons are known to have been crushed and burned to death and eighty others seriously and perhaps fatally injured in a head-on collision near Woodville, Ind., forty-eight miles out of Chicago, yesterday, between the second section of a Baltimore & Ohio train and a fast freight train.

The wreck resulted from the lack of proper signals on the first section of the immigrant train. All but one of the six cars of the passenger train were burned and all but six of the bodies were incinerated.

The outgoing freight train, No. 98, stopped at Babcock, Ind., to allow the first section of No. 47, the immigrant train, to pass. The engineer did not see a green light on the forward end to indicate that the second section was following. He started his train forward.

The engineer on the second section of the immigrant train did likewise. It is believed he thought the track was clear. The trains were running at full speed when they met on a curve one-quarter of a mile west of Woodville.

The only warning the sleeping foreigners had was the shrieks of the engine whistles and the jerk of the stopping passenger coaches. The next moment the crash came and the cars left the rails.

ENGINEERS GET RAISE

Also a Ten Hour Day From the Lackawanna

VOLE OF ERIE FIREMEN

On Strike Seems Unanimous—Western Switchmen Accept 4-Cent Raise—Butte, Mont., Miners Get Average Increase of 25 Cents.

New York, Nov. 12.—The demands of the engineers employed by the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad company were adjusted yesterday at a conference between President W. H. Truesdale and the representatives of the engineers. The engineers were granted a ten-hour day and increase in wages aggregating for the nine hundred engineers \$30,000 to \$35,000 a year. They were present at the conference beside President Truesdale, Grand Chief Workmen M. Stone of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and J. E. Clark, chairman of the grievance committee of the Lackawanna engineers. At its conclusion President Truesdale said that the demands of the men had been adjusted.

Mr. Clark said that the engineers had obtained practically all they asked for and that the new schedule will take effect at once. After the conference, Grand Chief Stone said: "I cannot make public the exact terms of the settlement until they are drawn up by President Truesdale."

"Will the engineers of the Erie railroad support the firemen in the event of a strike?" Mr. Stone was asked. "I hardly think so," Mr. Stone replied. "You know the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers is a rather big organization and has always kept its contracts."
