### ON UNUSUAL GROUNDS.

Ploof Brings Suit—Alleges Putnam's Agent Cast Sloop Adrift.

Burlington, Nov. 16.—Henry W. Putnam of New York, who owns a valuable estate on Putnam's island, a quarter of a mile out in Lake Champlain from the town of Charlotte, was made the defendant Wednesday in a suit for damages based on unusual grounds.

The action is brought by Sylvester Ploof, who alleges that through the act of Mr. Putnam's agent, the sloop, in which Ploof and his family were sailing, was wrecked two years ago, the lives of the occupants endangered and the sloop and its furnishings, representing Ploof's entire earthly possessions, lost. Damages of \$3,000 are asked, the writ being returnable in the Clarendon county court.

According to the writ Ploof and his wife and two children and Mr. and Mrs. George Ploof and their baby left Ferrisburgh, Vt., November 13, 1904, to sail to Willboro, N. Y. During a gale which sprang up, the sloop was driven down the lake in the direction of Putnam's island, and Ploof decided to tie his craft up to a dock there.

He got into a small boat, and rowing to the dock, made a hasty fast to the dock. He had returned to the sloop when, it is alleged, Mr. Putnam's agent, Albert Williams, threw off the hawser and set the sloop adrift in the lake in spite of the protests of Ploof, so that the craft was blown onto a ledge half a mile distant.

It is alleged that the occupants were drowned, the sloop rendered worthless and all supplies destroyed. Ploof and his family were at that time making their home on the sloop, and had all their belongings with them.

In addition to the anguish of mind which he and his companions suffered, Ploof alleges that he was obliged to seek aid from the public. Putnam's island has been attached in the writ.



### FIRE IN BRANDON.

Gipeon Grist Mill and Walker & Amidon Grain Store Burned.

Brandon, Nov. 16.—A loss of \$15,000 was caused by a fire Wednesday. Five buildings being destroyed. The burned buildings were the grist mill and two other buildings of H. M. Gipeon, lumber dealer, and the grain store of Walker & Amidon. Mr. Gipeon lost a considerable amount of lumber. There was partial insurance on all the buildings.

The fire was discovered Wednesday night about 12 o'clock in the grist mill building. The flames were first discovered issuing from rooms occupied by W. A. Fuller for rendering lard, but within a very few moments had communicated with the Gipeon pine lumber store rooms in the same building and hope of saving the property was given up. The building was brick and wood and was completely gutted. A large building below the mill owned by H. D. Briggs was also consumed.

By quick and persistent work on the part of our local fire company, the flames were checked here, notwithstanding the close proximity of frame buildings. A large frame building adjoining the mill was not burned. H. M. Gipeon lost some 50,000 feet of dry pine lumber. Insurance about \$1,000. Amidon & Walker, millers, loss unknown, fully insured. The building and milling machinery was the property of the Neshope Electric company and was insured for \$6,000. Loss about \$10,000.

### NEW STEEL DEAL ON.

Reported Negotiation for Absorption of the La Belle Company.

Pittsburg, Nov. 16.—James Gale, first vice president of the United States Steel corporation, and the officials and directors of La Belle Iron company of Steubenville, O., are registered at the Fort Pitt hotel. It is reported that the visit of the steel and iron masters in an open negotiation for the absorption of La Belle plant by the steel corporation.

Edwin H. Ohl of this city held an option on these works last spring—on behalf, it is said, of John W. Gates and the Republic Iron and Steel company interests.
