Big Pond at Chittenden.

Rutland, Dec. 20.—Several prominent
Rutland men are making preparations
to organize a fishing club and to erect
a substantial club house on the big
pond in Chittenden formed by the big
dam built by the Rutland Light &
Power company. This pond in the past
two years has netted many strings of
abnormally large trout and with its
many feet streams it has every prospect
of providing for years to come the best
trout fishing in Vermont. The idea of
the Rutland men is to get a sufficient
number of gentlemen interested to
build a club house large enough to ac-
commodate at least 20 people at a time
