Washington, D. C., Jan. 21.—The Vermont commission to the Jamestown centennial exposition, consisting of Lieutenant Governor George H. Prouty, secretary, Hon. J. F. Manning, Edgar O. Stevens, Fred L. Davis, Edward M. Goddard, and James E. Pollard, have returned to Vermont after their visit to the exposition grounds near Norfolk, Va.

Secretary Forbes states that every attention was shown the Vermonters during their stay in Norfolk. They were met at the steamboat landing by officers of the exposition company and escorted to the grounds by special electric car.

The visitors were entertained at the Virginia club during their stay in Norfolk and as a dinner given in honor of Senator Prouty and the commissioners.

The commissioners returned to Washington by boat and on the journey up the Potomac a business meeting was held to discuss the work of providing a suitable building and securing exhibits.

BEARING AID TO KINGSTON Supply Ships Leave New York For Devastated City

WILL SEND MORE LATER New York Relief Committee Announces That It Will Receive Further Contributions and Forward Them as Soon as Possible—Ships Sailing.

New York, Jan. 21.—The Hamburg-American line steamer Allegheny, with a large quantity of stores and clothing for the sufferers by the earthquake in Jamaica, sailed from New York Saturday for Kingston.

The supply boat Glacier of the United States navy department left the Brooklyn navy-yard Saturday with hundreds of tons of ammunition and supplies aboard for the United States fleet stationed in West Indian waters.

PEACE BOUGHT AT BIG COST Troubles in House of Marlborough Patched Up

SEPARATION, NO DIVORCE Understood That Duke Has Annuity of \$100,000 Settled Upon Him by Family of Duch—The Woman Allowed Use of Marlborough Jewels.

London, Jan. 21.—The conferences which have recently been going on between relatives, lawyers and others concerning the differences between the duke and duchess of Marlborough have resulted in an arrangement by which their affairs will not be brought before the courts and a separation will be effected, so as to avoid publicity.

This was largely brought about through the intervention of royalty, which is friendly to both sides, and desirous of averting public proceedings involving the ancient jewel house.

KEEP AT THE BREAD LINE Wages of the Laborer Never Above the Bread Line.

FOOD, CLOTHING, SHELTER Are All That Capital Allows the Worker —All Above Bare Necessities Are Absorbed by the Employer.

The thinker has long maintained that the wages of the laborer are always near the bread line—that is, he is paid only as much wages as it requires to reproduce himself in good working order, the employer well knowing that he must keep his workman supplied with food, shelter and raiment sufficient to protect him and his family and allow reproduction in order to keep the mines, factories, farms and so forth running.

As an example of some of the wages paid the following is quoted: Common laborers, from \$1 to \$1.50 per day; carpenters, \$2.50 to \$3; printers, \$2.75 to \$4; painters, \$2; plumbers, \$2 to \$4; paperhangers, \$2.50 to \$3; brick masons, \$4.50 to \$5; plasterers, 35 cents per hour; teamsters, \$1 per day; textile mill hands, 50 cents a day and up.
