**DOUMA OPPOSITION GAINS**

Well in Lead in the Russian Elections

**24 SEATS ARE ASSURED**

Conservatives So Far Have Only Five—Russian Bastille Restored to Its Former Use as a Prison.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 8.—The opposition parties are well in the lead in the elections in European Russia, having, on the basis of the returns up to noon yesterday, twenty-four seats in Parliament assured and seventy-six practically certain. The Conservatives have five assured and thirty-nine probable seats. Judging from Wednesday's returns, two more provinces, Karan, with five representatives in Parliament, and Stavropol, with three representatives, were carried by the opposition. The province of Orel, with eight representatives, apparently gives a slender majority to the Octoberists and Monarchists. In Kiev, with fifteen, Moscow with six, and Nizhni-Novgorod, with six representatives, the result will be close, with the chances in favor of the opposition. The results in the other provinces are not yet determined. Two of the leading political lawyers of St. Petersburg, Marzolin and Margulies, and a brother of Father Gapon, an extreme Radical, are among the successful candidates in Kiev.

**Russian Bastille Again in Use.**

On account of the revival of terrorism and political crimes, the Schlusselburg fortress, famous as the Russian Bastille, has been restored to its former use as a prison for persons sentenced to imprisonment for political crimes. Twenty sailors of the Black sea fleet have just been taken there in chains to serve

sentences of life imprisonment for participation in the mutiny at Sebastopol. The fortress will also be used again for executions.

It was announced from St. Petersburg on February 15, 1906, that the Schlusselburg fortress, whose casemates since the reign of Catherine the Great had harbored political prisoners and within which most of the executions of the Terrorists of late years had taken place, had been emptied, that the keepers had been disbanded, and that the walls would be left standing for use as a show place. During the night of February 14, 1906, five famous political prisoners, the last inmates of the fortress, were taken from their cells and sent to Siberia to serve the remainder of their sentences. They included Gerschunin and Melnikoff, who assassinated Minister of the Interior Siplaguine, and organized the Fighting Organization of the Social Revolutionists. Gerschunin succeeded in escaping from Siberia last year in an empty barrel, and eventually reached San Francisco, and later New York in December last. His companion, Melnikoff, is still in Siberia. The other three prisoners taken to Siberia at the same time were Sasonoff, the murderer of Minister of the Interior Von Plehve; Sikoritsky, Sasonoff's accomplice, and Karpovich, who killed Minister of Education Bogaleff in 1901. The sentences of all the men had been materially ameliorated by the amnesty decree of Emperor Nicholas in November, 1905.

**VATICAN PICKS FLAWS IN LATEST FRENCH PROPOSALS.**

Will Not Accept Certain of Minister Briand's Provisions.

Rome, Feb. 8.—The Vatican authorities, after studying the text of the circular issued by the French minister of education, M. Briand, to the mayors re-

garding the making of contracts with the parish priests for the lease of the churches, have decided not to accept the clause which provides that the mayors may now renew contracts with new parish priests, as this, it is held here, would submit the priests to the mayors' exequaturs.

Nor will the Vatican accept the proposed amendment in the organizations of cultural associations, as it is not provided that the latter shall recognize the hierarchy.
