TO INCREASE REVENUE.

Railroads Have Begun to Lay Their Plans.

Chicago, Feb. 7.—The railroads of this country have begun laying plans to drag back into their coffers at least some of the millions which they recently handed out to their employees in the shape of increased wages. The shippers are to pay.

If the proposition to increase the rates on nearly all of the main commodities 10 per cent, by increasing the minimum which it is permitted to load into a car goes into effect millions of dollars yearly will be added to the revenues of the traffic lines.

The first active steps were taken yesterday at a meeting in this city which was attended by the executive officials of railroads having a total of more than one hundred thousand miles of lines. The roads initially interested extend throughout the territory east of this city and north of the Ohio river clear to the sea-board and north into Canada.

In this territory freight rates are controlled by the organizations known as the Central Freight association, whose jurisdiction extends to Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and the Trunk Line association, whose jurisdiction extends from those cities to the Atlantic Ocean. The vote which is now being taken following a recommendation adopted by the two associations is being sought through a letter of advice setting forth the plan and giving the reasons therefor. If the plan meets with any opposition it will not be carried out.
