

NO BILLS BY SUFFOLK GRAND JURY

Reported to Provident Securities Case—Also Regarding Exchange Club.
Boston, Feb. 11.—A no bill was reported in the so-called "Provident securities and banking company case" by the Suffolk county grand jury at Boston, Saturday. The company failed more than a year ago, entailing a loss of about \$100,000 to thousands of small depositors and under conditions which prompted investigation by the district attorney. District Attorney Moran began work on the case soon after the suspension of the bank, but it was not until recently that the evidence was submitted to the grand jury. The bank itself was unwise and one of the financial managers admitted they could not control. "A no bill" was returned also in the case of the Exchange club, a prominent organization in the Boston business district, which had been accused of violating the liquor law by selling liquor to other clubs which assembled at the Exchange club house for banquets, Lieut. Gov. Eben S. Draper figured in this investigation as president of the Exchange club and as the officer to whom District Attorney Jerome sent a letter calling for information as to the club's methods. To this communication the lieutenant-governor made no response.

PEEVED IN WRONG WINDOW.

Peevy Must Now Get Along With Only One Eye.
Canandaigua, N. Y., Feb. 11.—Ira Peevy, twenty-one years old, of South Bristol, five miles west of Canandaigua, was brought to the hospital here Saturday with his right eye shot out and the right side of his face partly shot off and filled with particles of glass. Peevy was shot by Frank Bills, an aged veteran of Egypt, in the extreme western part of Ontario county, among the South Bristol hills. It is alleged that Peevy was prowling around Bills' cabin and was shot while peeping through a window. He may die. He is the only son of a widowed mother. It is said that Peevy and some companions had been treated to hard cider during the day by Bills, and had returned for more. Officers are after Bills.
