"Old Newbury seminary was started here in Newbury in the fall of 1834, continuing until its removal to Montpelier in 1869. It was the leading school of its class, and the chief auxiliary of the Methodist church during its existence in Newbury. The school drew a very large patronage from Caledonia county. I have several copies of an excellent history of Old Newbury seminary containing one hundred pages which I shall be glad to exchange for any one of the catalogues above named."

**BRYAN LAUDS UNIONS.**  
Says Work of Organized Labor Cannot Be Overestimated.  
William Jennings Bryan at the closing conference in Chicago in connection with the recent industrial exhibition expressed the opinion that trades unions have done more good for society than any other force in this country.  
"The unions have made some mistakes, but they have accomplished more good," he said, "than any other force in this country."  
"When we consider that through trades unions wages have been increased, hours shortened and comfort afforded the workmen in greater measure," he said, "I think we have a right to say the benefits resulting from these unions cannot be overestimated. Perhaps no other force in the country ever has been so effective for improvement in the citizenship and general moral qualities of our people."  
"But if we omit this phase of the union energies entirely and consider two other channels through which the labor organizations have worked successfully, I believe we will find enough to support my assertion. I mean the activities of the unions in respect to politics and the restriction of child labor."  
"The Australian ballot system, for one thing, is largely due to this country to the agitation of the trades unions. I almost feel safe in saying that had it not been for the interest taken in this reform by these organizations we might still be employing the old system of voting."  
"If the labor union had never done anything else than raise the age limit of employment of children in the mines and factories of this nation, I believe that accomplishment alone would justify its existence. No influence in this country ever has been so evil in its effects as the tendency to crowd our workshops with children of tender years. It is a most destructive tendency, and one that the public conscience should protest against."  
Referring to women in industry, Mr. Bryan said he believed women might accomplish as much as men through organization into unions.

**OLDEST RESIDENT OF VERMONT.**  
Mrs. Eliza Paine Allen, now in her 96th year, is not only the oldest person living in Vermont, but she is one of the most interesting and entertaining persons in the town. She has just recovered from a critical illness.  
Mrs. Allen resides with her son, Jason Cady Allen, who has held all the town offices and served in the legislature. She is a constant attendant of the Advent Christian church. She makes a special effort to attend church on rainy Sundays, saying that these are the Sundays when her presence is most needed.  
It was a strictly religious atmosphere in which Mrs. Allen was reared and she recalls that when a girl she and other children put away their playthings every Saturday at sundown and refrained from noise and laughter until the following sundown, when the observance of Sunday was at an end. When Scott's Waverley novels appeared she became much interested in them, but her parents put a stop to her reading them.  
Mrs. Allen was the daughter of Rowell and Clarissa (Burt) Doolittle, sixth in descent from Abigail Doolittle, of New Haven, Conn., the ancestor of all the Doolittles in this country. She was born in Townsend February 23, 1812. In 1832 she was married to Robert Allen.  
The couple settled in Wallingford. They had seven children, of whom Peor Allen, of Palmer, Mass., a well known historical and genealogical writer, the next is Jason Cady Allen, of Vernon, and the youngest is Robert Clark Allen, of North Springfield.
