CORNISH TREASURE TROVE

Buried Gold Found by Farmer Claimed by the Duchy

Mr. De Castro Glubb, coroner, held an inquest at Liskeard Guildhall the other day in Trembrase farmyard near the town. The coroner stated that no similar inquiry had been held in Cornwall for at least one hundred years.

His mother's family, he said had owned the farm for many years, and he produced a document dated July 13, 1745, relating to the finding of fifty-five and one-half guineas in the floor of the barn by John Croker and Dorothy, his wife. Mr. Volk, jeweller of Liskeard, said many of the coins were rare. Eight were Portuguese milreis, dated 1682 to 1725. The remainder were English, the most ancient being three gold units, or two pieces, of James I. and Charles I., while the rest were guinea pieces dating from 1680 to 1725.
