INDUSTRIAL ITEMS.

The process of manufacturing silk made from wood pulp is one which in Europe is jealously guarded from inspection. The imitation silk sells for considerably less than real silk, but at a higher price than mercerized cotton.

Until the new ten hour law went into effect a few months ago the laboring men of France worked twelve hours a day. They began at 6 a. m. and quit at 7 p. m., with one hour at noon. Women are not allowed to work at night, and child labor under fourteen years of age is prohibited.

The sisal industry is becoming an important one, about 1,000 acres having already been planted in Hawaii. Experiments indicate that it can be successfully cultivated from sea level up to 2,500 feet and with a rainfall as high as sixty inches. Hawaiian sisal is pronounced by fiber experts to be equal to that produced in Yucatan.

The earth is five and a half times heavier than a globe of water of the same size would be.

Thorium, one of the rare metals, was discovered by Berzelius in 1828 in a Norwegian mineral called thorite, from the Scandinavian god Thor. Water does not act upon it, and nitric and sulphuric acids act on it with difficulty.
