ABOUT THE STATE.

Items of Interest Gleaned From Our Exchanges.

The health department ordered that no services be held in the Baptist Congregational and Methodist churches at Essex Junction Sunday because it is feared that the community has been exposed to diphtheria. This action was caused by the death of a child, Della White. Her parents, supposing that she was suffering from mumps, did not call a physician until the day before her death. Several families will be kept in quarantine for several days.

Charles Hughes, James Miles and Charles Flint went to Plattsburg, 25 miles away, Saturday in a 30-foot gasoline launch. When near that city one of the cylinders blew out, nearly wrecking the boat. They prepared a launch to tow them home, and when about half way across the lake they ran into a thunder shower and a bolt of lightning struck the boat, splintering it and rendering unconscious Mr. Hughes, who was at the wheel, and severely shocking the other two men. Hughes was rescued and probably will recover. The boat is badly damaged.

Last these specious falsehoods, carefully disguised as arguments, appear plausible to some, let us continue to reiterate that alcoholic beverages are poison, first, last and always, that alcohol is dangerous and unnecessary, and that the enemy is wearing sheep's clothing "for revenge only."

PEABODY OUT; BRANDED LIAR

Police Commissioner Bingham Scores Detective and Dismisses Him.

New York, June 24.—Detective William E. Peabody was dismissed from the New York police force yesterday after a trial on a charge of giving false testimony, being absent without leave and disobedience. Peabody was sent to Baltimore by Police Inspector McLaughlin to investigate a report that Mrs. Howard Gould had been married before her marriage to Mr. Gould, but failed to disclose such evidence. When questioned about his trip he made statements which he afterwards declared to be false.

QUEEN OF HOLLAND TO GREET PEACE DELEGATES

Will Receive Them in the Famous "House in the Wood."

The Hague, June 25.—Queen Wilhelmina arrived here privately yesterday from Castle Loo and drove in a closed carriage from the railroad station to the royal palace, passing through the Hall of Knights. She will remain here only two days and will receive the delegates to the peace conference.

JAPANESE MILLET.

This Excellent Fodder Promises Well in New England.

For a few years this excellent fodder plant has been given a trial in different parts of New England. In Maine it promises well, while in northern Vermont it is considered of much value for fodder purposes.

This is a large growing variety of millet, with solid stalk like corn, plenty of leaves, wide spreading top and grows from four to six feet in height. This makes it an excellent crop for feeding green to cows.

Its principal value would seem to be for this purpose, although it is said to make good fodder when cured.

A Hot Weather Plant.
It requires a rich, dry, warm soil and should not be sown too early, as it is a hot weather plant. The soil should be made mellow and fine, for the seeds are small. Fifteen to twenty pounds of seed should be sown to the acre. It is not considered a good crop with which to seed down to grass, as the growth is too thick and heavy for this purpose. With favorable conditions immense yields are obtained, according to a writer in American Cultivator.

The stalks, while tall, are not usually over one-fourth of an inch in diameter. It should be in condition to feed a little before corn.

Better Than Corn.
A neighbor speaks most enthusiastically of this crop for feeding to cows green. He finds it better than corn, producing more milk and yielding heavily. Dairy farmers will do well to give this fodder plant a trial, as it can be sown later than fodder corn.

Squash Bugs and Moles.
Look out for black squash bugs on melon, cucumber and squash vines. When numerous, they do a lot of damage. Hand picking in the early morning is about the only remedy, says a writer in Farm Journal.

Moles are a nuisance in the truck patch, but they are not hard to trap if one knows their habits. They go to their feeding grounds three times a day—early in the morning, about noon and late afternoon. A good mole trap set in the regular runway will get them.

To Water Calvary.
If it is a dry season water should be given. Calvary is a thirsty plant and requires an abundance of moisture. Many people make the mistake of giving water a little at a time and often. It is far better to soak the ground thoroughly, then leave it until dry, writes a grower in American Agriculturist. After the water has been applied an inch or more of loose soil should be heaped over the surface. This will prevent rapid evaporation.
