IN QUEST OF AN HEIR.

The Great Napoleon and What Might Have Been.

Had Josephine borne Napoleon an heir the history of France and indeed all Europe must have been very different. In the hours of triumph after Waterloo Napoleon realized that had the young German fanatic who had come to attempt his life been successful in his mission one thrust from that vulgar kitchen knife which the old comrade would have shattered all the gloom whose shadowing had caused such rivers of blood to flow. He resolved upon the divorce of Josephine. He would take as his wife a princess and found a dynasty. Whom should he marry? Should it be a princess of the Russian royal house or a princess of another? He slept in the palace of the man whom he had but newly conquered, the emperor of Austria, and slept, as fate would have it, in the very room in which the heir for whom he prayed was destined to die. Under the roof of the son of the Caesars he resolved to marry that man's daughter. A little while earlier she had heard that the tide of battle had turned against the French and had written to her father: "We have heard with great joy that Napoleon was present at the battle which was lost. If he would only lose his head as well!" The writer of the words became, ten months after the French troops entered Vienna as conquerors, the bride of the man whose death she now wished.

She was the granddaughter of Marie Antoinette, and by his marriage to her Napoleon believed it would be the salvation of France. A man wiser in the matter than himself had pointed to a Russian marriage, foreseeing renewed hostilities with either Austria or Russia. Napoleon, he said, knew his way to Vienna; he doubted whether he knew the road to St. Petersburg. Napoleon chose to find, as he afterward said, that the marriage was but an abyss strewn with flowers. The marriage led inevitably to the calamitous Russian campaign and to the breakup of his empire. His ruin began with his marriage to the princess who was to be the mother of his child. All France acclaimed the union with joy, which was eclipsed only by the birth of the heir—St. James' Gazette.

Was of a Family of Railroad Men.

Marshall N. Clapp, of Bennington, who died Wednesday night, July 10, of Bright's disease, was 64 years old, and had always followed railroading, first as an engineer on the Troy & Boston and Western Vermont roads and later on the New Jersey Central, running the Royal Blue express train for many years, and retiring from the road several years ago. His father was an engineer on the Bennington & Rutland railroad, and his brother Charles, is an engineer of one of the Royal Blue expresses on the New Jersey Central. During the Civil War Mr. Clapp was a member of Company A, 4th Vt. Volunteers, and at that time was lieutenant and commander of George A. Custer 8th Corps post of Bennington. He is survived by his wife, who was Miss Caroline Wadsworth of Bennington, and one son, Marshall, of New York.

RENEZVOUS AT 6 A. M.

Companies of Vermont National Guard Must Get Early Start.

Lieut. Leslie A. I. Chapman, First Cavalry, is the officer detailed by the government to observe and report on the muster of the First National Guard, to be held at the state grounds at Fort Ethan Allen, beginning August 6.

The general order for the annual muster contains some new features this year. The regiment will rendezvous at the camp grounds at six o'clock in the morning, instead of arriving at all hours of the day as heretofore. Instead of a detail being sent ahead by each company to prepare camp a small regimental detail will be sent on August 6 to issue canvas, poles and tent pins when the men arrive.

The new light blue chambray shirts are to be issued to the men on arrival at camp.
