

BUNCH HITS OFF GLAZE

St. Louis Won Yesterday's Game From Boston

DID IT IN FIRST INNING

Howell Had the Locals Guessing All the Time, the Only Tally Being on a Home Run by Glaze in the Fifth.

Boston, Aug. 7.—Three hits, a pass and an error at the plate gave St. Louis four runs in the first inning yesterday afternoon, which were more than enough as the best Boston could do was a home run by Glaze, while the visitors offset that with another tally in the fifth. The score was 5 to 1, and it was the last game of the present series.

Glaze had a bad first inning, but after that pitched good ball until taken out in the seventh and hit Hoey but when Morgan, recently released from St. Louis, finished the game in the box. Howell had the locals tied up all the time. Neither side could get more than five safe runs.

That is the President's Sole Ambition, According to One OF HIS CLOSEST FRIENDS

No Thought of Third Term—Hopes to Be Able to Serve New York State in Upper House for the Remainder of His Life.

Washington, D. C., Aug. 7.—President Roosevelt has but one ambition for his own future. He wants to be a senator of the United States from the state of New York when he has finished his term as president, and he doesn't want anything else.

The authority on which this statement is made is the highest possible. President Roosevelt is not personally going around telling everyone what he wants, but there is no room whatever for doubt that his personal desire is to step from the White House into the Senate chamber, and as the successor of Thomas Caffery Platt, be present at the first recall of the extra session that is presidentially scheduled to convene on August 20.

All of the talk about the possibility of President Roosevelt succeeding his father has been the veriest moonshine, so far as the president himself was concerned. Undoubtedly there is a large number of citizens that would like to have Mr. Roosevelt in the White House for four years after his present term expires, and it is equally true that a few months ago there were some tentative efforts to crystallize and organize the sentiment. These efforts, which might have resulted in stampeding the next Republican national convention for the Rough Rider, did not have the presidential action.
