

PERMITS GEORGE'S MARRIAGE. Pope Issues Dispensation For Union of Grecian Prince and Princess.

Rome, Oct. 11.—The Pope has granted a dispensation permitting the marriage of Princess Maria Bonaparte, who is a Catholic, to Prince George of Greece, who is a member of the Orthodox Greek church, on the condition, which is to be set forth in a signed document, that any children resulting from the union shall be brought up as Catholics. The pope is understood to have hesitated before granting the dispensation, owing to the similar promises in regard to the bringing up of children in the Catholic faith, which have not been kept, notably in the case of the Princess Marie of Orleans, a Catholic, who was married to Prince Vladimir of Denmark in 1885, and whose sons have been brought up as Protestants, the religion of their father.

DERRICK FALLS; FOUR KILLED. Many Others Hurt in Cleveland Accident.

Cleveland, O., Oct. 11.—Four men were killed and several others seriously hurt, two of whom are thought to be fatally injured, by the falling of a derelict when a new bridge is being constructed over the Cuyahoga river for the New York, Chicago & St. Louis (Nickel Plate) railway company yesterday.
