New York, Oct. 14.—A police charge and two arrests broke up a demonstration by striking telegraphers in front of the Western Union building early today.

Western Union Superintendent Brooks said today that the company would not prosecute the two men arrested, that the arrest was the work of the police and not of the corporation.
